# Who we are

Haringey's Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Information, Advice and Support Service (SEND IASS) is provided by Markfield, an inclusive community hub which promotes disabled, Deaf and autistic people's rights, equality and independence.

## We offer a free, impartial and confidential service:

- **Support** in attending meetings, contributing to assessments and reviews and participating in decisions about outcomes for the child or young person.
- **Directing** children, young people, parents to additional support services where needed, including support relating to preparing for adulthood, such as transition, living arrangements and employment support.
- **Help** when things go wrong, including support in arranging or attending early disagreement resolution meetings.
- **Support** in managing mediation, appeals to the First-tier Tribunal for Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), school exclusions, and complaints on matters related to SEN and Disability.

# Our services

## Advice surgeries

Face-to-face appointments for parents and young people to discuss concerns, prepare for meetings such as Annual Reviews, fill in forms or applications, write letters, and share information about other services. Surgeries are held at Markfield and a number of schools and children's centres in Haringey.

## Get involved

We run a termly parents and professionals SENDIASS reference group meetings. Both groups support the service by contributing ideas, looking at ways of working and assist with continuous improvement. If you would like to attend the dates of the next meeting and contact details can be found on the SENDIASS website.

## Higher-level support

Sometimes families may find themselves in very difficult circumstances for example children or young people who have been excluded, just had a diagnosis, or carers with a disability themselves. In these cases we aim to allocate a named Family Support Worker who can provide one-to-one support.

## Training workshops

We provide regular training about the SEND system and exclusion guidelines. Training is FREE for carers and young people.

## SEND IASS volunteers

Our volunteers have experience of the SEND system and have been trained to offer support to parents and young people in preparing for and attending meetings.

## Independent Young Advisors

Our steering group of youth volunteers are recruited from Haringey secondary schools, trained and supported to ensure the voice of young people with SEND is at the heart of our service.
